Student Presentation Events

UConn Change Grant recipient Cameron Slocum's BFA exhibition, Material World: Design for a Healthful and Equitable Future, is on display throughout the semester with an exhibit reception on November 1st from 3-5pm in Gant Science Complex Light Court. Cameron's research, planning, and construction demonstrate real-life examples of attainable alternatives. The project personifies the designer's re-imagination of material culture in the design sphere. Each component used in Material World was selected after careful research regarding total life cycle and holistic sustainable properties. The exhibit consists of compostable mycelium panels, formaldehyde-free plywood, Global Organic Textile Standard (GOTS) certified cotton canvas, VOC-free milk paint, and locally-sourced wood from the UConn Forest. Material samples—intended to be touched—provide an opportunity for visitors to learn about the diverse qualities of sustainable materials.
